Reading books/Phonics

Your child has already begun daily phonics sessions, learning the letter sounds that they will need to read.

Your child will not receive a school reading book straight away - this will happen once they are confidently able to blend sounds for reading. Once they do receive a reading book, they will be expected to read daily at home. Please record when you have heard them read - in their reading record book - at least 3 times per week. Reading books will be checked and changed each week. School reading books sent home will be at your child's phonics ability level so that they can read it independently.

<u>Homework</u>

Your child will be given a phonics sound booklet every week (containing the sounds that they have learnt that week). Please practise reading and writing these sounds as much as possible. Please encourage your child to form them correctly.

Your child will be given a piece of maths or English homework via Learning with Parents. You should receive this on a Friday night and should be completed by the following Friday so that we can look at your comments and photographs that you have upload onto Learning with Parents, in class. If you have any issues with the Learning with Parent homework, please let us know.

There is a homework challenge for your child to complete each half term (Please see the homework challenge letter for more information). Your child will be able to choose which challenge they wish to do and bring it into school on the morning of Wednesday 16th October. All parents and children are to the Homework Challenge Drop In after school at 3.15pm. - so that you can see what the children have produced.

Library Books

On a Friday, your child will be able to choose a reading book to share with you at home. Please ensure that these come back into school EVERY Friday.

<u>PE</u>

Our PE day this half term will be on a <u>Friday</u>. Please ensure that your child comes to school wearing their full PE kit, hair tied back, and earrings removed/taped over (they need to be able to do this independently).

Water bottles

Please make sure that your child has a named, water bottle - filled with clean water - in school, every day.

<u>Trips</u>

The EYFS children will also be taking a geographical walk around the village this half term too - in order to look at homes and houses.
