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EYFS and Year 1 Homework Challenges – Summer Term 2 2024

This half term, we will continue to set a homework project based on our topics. We would like children to select at least one of the challenges below, however children can do as many as they wish. This will continue to be run alongside the regular reading, spellings and maths that are set each week.

PSHE - Changing me (EYFS and Year 1)

What is the life cycle of a human? Draw a picture of each stage of the life cycle and write a sentence or two to go with each stage. What can you do at each stage which you can't do at other stages? How does your body change at each stage?

(Note for parents - The stages of a human life cycle are baby, toddler, childhood, adolescence, adulthood, and old age).



Maths- Time (EYFS and Year 1)

Measure and record your daily routine using an analogue clock. You could make a poster to show the time you do these things:

- Wake up
- Eat breakfast
- Get dressed
- Go to school
- Eat lunch
- Get home from school
- Have a bath/shower
- Go to bed



Science- Materials and Magnets (Year 1)

Find things around your home which are magnetic/non-magnetic. You could record in a table or take photographs of the things you find.





Art- Investigating Sculpture (Year 1)

Go for a walk around the village or King's Lynn. Sketch the different sculptures that you can find.



<u>History- Parliament and Prime</u> <u>Ministers (Year 1)</u>

Create a factile poster about Sir Robert Walpole (the first ever prime minister).

Add a picture of him and maybe the houses of parliament.

Add some facts about him too.



EYFS- Under the Sea

Create an under the sea scene using a shoebox. What creatures might you find under the sea?
