Class 2: Term 1

English

The 'Talk for Reading' and 'Talk for Writing' strategies will continue to be studied during this half term.

This half term we will be looking at writing an explanation text by using The Teacher Pleaser (our model text) to assist us.

We will then move on to our recount unit - writing a letter, we will become familiar with a recount letter by learning the structure and key features, we will then innovate our recount by changing certain sections, after that we will invent our own recount using all what we have learnt.

Grammar/ punctuation sessions will happen daily during our English lessons. We will recap skills preciously taught such as punctuation including capital letters, full stops, exclamation and question marks for year 2, subordinating, co-ordinating and time conjunctions for year 3 and learn new skills such as generalisers and determiners for year 3, subordinating and co-ordinating conjunctions and time conjunctions for year 2

In addition to spelling/ phonics and English we will have handwriting sessions to help children develop a confidence in writing using a cursive joined style.

Maths

We will finish our maths unit of multiplication and division unit in the first few weeks by focusing on multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by a 1 digit number.

The next unit will look at length and perimeter, by measuring in metres, centimetres and millimetres, then looking at equivalent measures, comparing length, adding and subtracting length. Then moving onto perimeter by measuring and calculating the perimeter of shapes.

To conclude this half-term, we will begin to look at fractions - this will begin by looking at and understanding denominators, the whole and comparing and ordering fractions.

Times tables will be taught regularly using 'Tackling Tables' By the end of Year 2 children should know their multiplication and division facts for the 2, 5- and 10-times table. By the end of Year 3 children should know their multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4- and 8-times table.

At the beginning of each daily maths lesson we will have a arithmetic session to help them build the four key skills of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. On Fridays the children will have a chance to apply these skills independently in their arithmetic tests. Afterwards we will go through any answers together and address any misconceptions straight away.
